- when a new interest arises;
- at the start of meetings; and
- annually.

Cyber Crime

Cybercrime is a crime in which a computer is the object of the crime, or is used as a tool to commit an offence. Cybercriminals may use computer technology to access personal or business information.

Be cautious when opening any emails and attachments. If you are sending any sensitive information electronically, it is important to check the email addresses of recipients. Any passwords you have should be strong (combination of letters and numbers, include upper and lower case and symbols); be changed at regular intervals; and different passwords should be used for each account. If you notice anything suspicious, report it to your Local Counter Fraud Specialist.
