This is a Freedom of Information request regarding your services policies and procedures when sepsis is identified by a PES crew.

- 1. Please enter the full name of your Ambulance Service.

 South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust
- 2. Do your Paramedic Emergency Service (PES) currently use a 'Sepsis' screening tool when treating patients? If yes, what is it?

 Yes. One for adults and one for children between 5 and 11
- 3. What is your services current treatment protocol when sepsis is identified by a Paramedic Emergency Service (PES) crew. Including prealerts to receiving units and specialist pathway activations.
 Care and intervention is provided according to the nationally published guidance in the Joint Royal College Ambulance Liaison Committee (JRCALC) clinical practice guidelines which are based on the UK Sepsis Trust guidance. Triggers for use of a sepsis screening tool are a NEWS2 score of 5 (or 3 or more in a single component) or clinician or care-giver concern. Pre-alerting to ED is based on the clinical assessment of the patient, the early warning score and locally defined protocol where applicable.
- 4. Has the Ambulance Service named in question 1 taken part in any form of 'Prehospital Sepsis Diagnosis and Treatment' trials?

 Yes
