We do not record illegal and legal drug cases separately, therefore the figures provided are inclusive of all cases where drugs were involved.

 What was the total cost of call outs involving drug poisonings involving illicit drugs in each of the last three reported years?

What are the most common forms of medical treatment provided by members of the ambulance service to those experiencing or who have experienced/are experiencing a drug poisoning, and in what proportion of cases are they provided (in each of the last three reported years)? Alternatively provide the number of cases in which each form of treatment has been provided.

In terms of ICD10 terms of reference, I'm generally looking at all of T40 and T42.4, and combinations thereof – unless F10-19 are used in cases of overdose, in which case F10-18 would cover acute drug intoxication, and F19 acute combined drug intoxication. In terms of treatment I'd be looking predominantly at pharmacological treatments if that's ok. We don't map to ICD10 codes in that level of detail.

Narcan and ED are the most common treatments for overdose and poisoning. Critical Care Paramedics carry Flumazenil for benzodiazepine overdose. What is the average cost of the most common treatment types used by the ambulance service in response to drug poisonings in each of the last three years?
