- ▲ Where you deem a patient to lack capacity you must clearly document your rationale in this tab, including free text fields in the right-most column
- 1 The best interest plan will only be accessible if the patient lacks capacity
- The ePCR will compare your answers to the legal definition of lacking capacity (Mental Capacity Act, 2005) and generate a response in the grey box towards the bottom of the screen
- For patients whose lack of capacity only becomes apparent at a later stage, this section can be edited later
- Use the breadcrumb (1.) to go back to the consent tab
- Use either the breadcrumb (1.) or the main navigation menu (2.) to go back to the primary survey
