Could you please provide details of the current scope of practice for critical care paramedics within your trust including PGD's specifically used by them.

The CCP specific PGD's are:

- Hyoscine Butylbromide (Management of terminal respiratory secretions)
- Calcium Chloride 10% (Management of cardiac arrest/peri-arrest from hyperkalaemia, OD of calcium-channel blocker or hypocalcaemia)
- Cyclizine (Management if nausea/vomiting in end of life care)
- Flumazenil (reversal of iatrogenic benzodiazepine overdose)
- Heparin Sodium (adjunctive therapy with thromboytic therapy)
- Ketamine [intranasal] (Mnaagement of acute traumatic pain in patients <12 years)
- Ketamine (severe pain)
- Ketamine (severe agitation)
- Ketamine (post-ROSC sedation)
- Ketamine (procedural sedation)
- Levetiracetam (2nd line treatment of status epilepticus)
- Magnesium Sulphate 50% (severe/life threatening asthma)
- Magnesium Sulphate 50% (eclampsia/severe preeclampsia)
- Magnesium Sulphate 50% [nebulsied] (severe life threatening asthma in patients 2-11 years)
- Midazolam (agitation in end of life care)
- Midazolam (management of seizures)
- Midazolam (management of seizures in end of life care)
- Midazolam (post-ROSC sedation)
- Rocuronium (neuromuscular blockade in post-ROSC care)
- Sodium Chloride 5% (actual or impending cerebral herniation in traumatic head injury)
