# Response

The Trust confirms it holds the information you requested.

Some concerns have been raised in regards to the recent shortlisting of applications for Trainee Critical Care Paramedic. These concerns are primarily based upon colleagues whom had covered all the essential and desirable criteria's have not been taken forward for assessment however those who did not have some of the essential criteria have been.

\*Background\* The Trainee Critical Care Paramedic vacancy received 209 applications, this advert was advertised via multiple sources including Indeed, NHS Jobs, SECAmb internal mailings, and our website directly.

# Breakdown for all applications

14.35% of shortlisted candidates were invited to interview26% identified as female16% identified as BAME15% identified themselves as members of the LGBTQ+ community25% were internal candidates
