Yes, in 2025 certain children's records are flagged as part of a Patient Specific Instruction process, in which children's specialist palliative care teams may contact the Trust indicating actions to take for ambulance clinicians at the time of 999 call, including actions in relation to care after death.

The Trust has no record of this process occurring in 2000.

Do/did you hold any documents with specific instructions about particular children? Or a list of particular children for whom (for whatever reason) a particular professional should be contacted on death?

Yes, in 2025 the Trust holds documents as per its Patient Specific Instruction process, in which children's specialist palliative care teams may contact the Trust indicating actions to take for ambulance clinicians at the time of 999 call, including actions in relation to care after death.
