I am writing in response to your enquiry under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) reference FOI/15/09/01.

You requested the following information:

1. The total number of 999 incidents responded to in the first quarter of 2015.

South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust responded to a total of 168,736 incidents from 1st January 2015 to 31st March 2015.

2. Percentage of total number of Red 1 calls arriving within 8 minutes and percentage of total number of Red 2 calls arriving in 8 minutes.

Please see the table below which shows this information:

	R1 responses within 8 mins	R2 responses within 8 mins
1 st Jan – 31 st Mar 2015	75.72%	74.69%

3. The total percentage (including numbers) of contribution towards the Red 1 and Red 2 response achievement where the response time was created by a non-directly employed resource*, broken down to show the contribution of:

- All Community First Responders schemes

3.0% (2,850)

- Static defibrillators at a site or location where the staff have been trained by the ambulance service

3.2% (2,192)

- Public Access Defibrillator, where a member of the public has agreed to obtain the defibrillator and taken it to the patient

7.6% (5,409)

- Where the location of a defibrillator triggers the automatic arrival of a vehicle within/ up to 200 metres of the incident for the purposes of stopping the clock for performance measuring purposes.

The location of a defibrillator does not trigger the automatic arrival of an ambulance. This information is entered manually by our call takers upon confirmation that the defibrillator is at the patient's side.

***By non-directly employed resources I am referring to voluntary community based response schemes, Fire Co-response schemes, off duty staff responder schemes, static defibrillators and Public Access Defibrillators.**

4. How many of these were also responded to by a directly employed resource? Did the ambulance get to the incident within the target time even though the clock stopped with the defibrillator triggering it to stop?

60.8% (41,532) This figure relates to the percentage and number of incidents during the period from 1st January 2015 and 31st March 2015 where a double crewed ambulance or single response vehicle was first on scene and arrived within 8 minutes.
