I am writing in response to your enquiry under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) reference FOI/16/02/25.

You requested the following information:

How many 999 calls were there in Canterbury in 2015, where an ambulance was refused to be sent to the caller?

South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust would not refuse to send an ambulance to a patient as not all 999 calls require an ambulance response. We are able to direct callers to more appropriate services and we have clinicians in our control rooms who are able to provide clinical advice over the phone to patients and callers.
