Directory of Domestic and Sexual Abuse Services

There are a number of agencies that can offer help on domestic and sexual abuse. The following list of national services is grouped in to sections where support is offered on specific issues. This is not a comprehensive list of all available services and is meant to be a starting point for people seeking help.

Before giving out a number, it is important to ask them if it is safe to take the number. Some abusers are very controlling and the person may be worried that their situation will get worse if the abuser learns that they are seeking help.

If someone is in immediate danger, they should be advised to ring 999

Domestic Abuse

National Domestic Violence 24 Hour Helpline – free, confidential service. Offers advice on all issues regarding domestic violence and can support women and children to access emergency refuge accommodation. Free phone number 0808 2000 247

Sexual Abuse

Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARC) – offers specialist medical and forensic services for anyone who has been raped or sexually abused. Most centres will only offer support in the immediate aftermath of an assault and do not tend to offer long term counselling or advocacy.

Rape Crisis Centres – offers a safe and confidential environment for women and girls who are survivors of rape, child sexual abuse, sexual harassment and any form of sexual violence.
