I am writing in response to your enquiry under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) reference FOI/17/01/30.

You requested the following information:

1. In each of the last three financial years (13/14) (14/15) and (15/16) how much have you paid to private taxi and mini cab firms for the transportation of patients.

South East Coast Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust uses taxis for non-emergency patient transport services journeys to hospitals and clinics.

Please see the table below which shows the expenditure on taxis for Patient Transport Services (PTS) for the requested years.

Financial Year	<b>Expenditure on taxis for PTS</b>
2013/2014	£284k
2014/2015	£211k
2015/2016	£396k

Taxis are not used for responding to 999 calls. However, we do make use of approved taxi companies to convey patients at times of peak demand where there is no medical need for an assessment at scene or ongoing clinical care when a patient is being transported to hospital.

These patients would have received a triage by a trained call handler and if the outcome of this assessment is for the patient to make their own way to a health care facility and for some reason they can't carry out that instruction but are able to travel in a car, the call would be referred to a Clinical Supervisor for assessment. The ambulance service has a duty of care to ensure patients are able to receive care even if there are social barriers to them getting help. The Clinical Supervisor would discuss with the patient what options are available to get to hospital and as a last resort a taxi would be booked if suitable to avoid an ambulance being used as a purpose of transport only.

Please see the table below which shows the expenditure on taxis for A & E patients for the requested years.

2. If it is possible to obtain from your records could you state the biggest fee paid to a taxi/mini cab firm in the 15/16 financial year for a single patient journey. Please state the towns or cities that were the collection and drop off venue.
