A red marker relates to the highest risk category and is defined as those addresses where information available makes it clear that staff have been physically assaulted or threatened with violence.

An amber marker relates to those addresses where information available makes it clear that there is a potential risk to crews, or of abusive, aggressive/ inappropriate behaviour.
