

MENTAL HEALTH RISK ASSESSMENT TOOL

1. Background history and general observations					
 Is the patient currently violent, aggressive and/or threatening? 					
Does the patient pose a risk to self, you or others?					
 Does the patient have a means and a plan to harm themselves/someone else? This means the patient has a <u>realistic</u> plan AND an <u>actual</u> means to carry out that plan 					
• Does the patient have any immediate (i.e. within the next few minutes or hours) plans to harm self, you or others?					
 Does the patient feel controlled or influenced by external forces? 					
 Is there any suggestion, or does it appear likely, that the patient may try to avoid treatment e.g. abscond from an A&E Department? 					
 Does the patient have a history of violence? * 					
 Does the patient have a history of self-harm? * 					
 Does the patient have a history of mental health problems or psychiatric illness? * 					
 Does the patient appear to be experiencing any delusions or hallucinations? 					
2. Appearance and behaviour					
 Is the patient obviously distressed, markedly anxious or highly aroused? 					
Is the patient behaving inappropriately to the situation?					
 Is the patient quiet and withdrawn? 					
 Is the patient attentive and co-operative? 					

3. Suicide risk screen - greater number of positive responses suggests greater level of risk

A judgement of risk is determined by where the <u>majority</u> of responses are ticked If <u>any RED</u> responses are ticked the patient must be determined as VERY HIGH risk
