I am writing in response to your enquiry under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) reference FOI/17/11/11.

You requested the following information, please also see our response below:

**Specifically, I would like to know how many patients were transported to the Emergency Department who had suspected cardiac chest pain but did NOT have ST elevation on their ECG (so a suspected N-STEMI or unstable angina). The timeline I am interested in is from 01.01.16 to 31.12.16.**

From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016 – 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016 there were 21581 incidents that a patient was transported to hospital for condition codes which relate to the following:

- Acute Coronary Syndrome
- Chest Pain Other Cause
- Non-STEMI ACS
