I am writing in response to your enquiry under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) reference FOI/18/02/16.

You requested the following information, please also see our response below:

I would like to know:

- How many addresses have been flagged as a high risk to staff safety?
- The general location of each flagged address (e.g. Canterbury, Crawley etc.)
- How many addresses were flagged in 2015, 2016 and 2017? Can I have the data broken down by calendar year?
- The reason why each address was flagged as a high risk.

*The information illustrated in 2015 and 2016 for Surrey is based on an indicative figure only. This is due to limited information being held on historical systems/databases

The figures above relate to red markers on addresses. A red marker relates to the highest risk category and is defined as those addresses where information available makes it clear that staff have been physically assaulted or threatened with violence.

We cannot give figures broken down by town, or give specific reasons as this may be identifiable to individuals.
