3. Any internal memos/directing released to divert ambulances from Maidstone A&E to other hospitals in this time period.

The decision to implement any diverts between hospitals is taken in conjunction with acute trust senior managers and senior SECAmb managers on a pro-active basis in response to operational need. Request's for diverting will normally be made by acute trusts, SECAmb then gives consideration to the impact of the request on service delivery and will agree to support or decline accordingly. There is also a requirement for acute trusts to ensure the relevant Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), and NHS England if necessary, is engaged in any discussion about the implementation of a formal divert, as other acute trusts and health services can be affected by these diverts and need to reach system wide agreement.
