The call was from the Police into our control room

Call Taker:	Hello police
Police:	Hiya, I'm just making you sure you're aware of the incident in Lewes at the moment at Lewes Castle?
Call Taker:	Lewes Castle, bear with me
Police:	Thank you
	(Pause)
Call Taker:	Do you have a patient name at all?
Police:	Erm I don't, basically we've just taken a call from East Sussex Fire to say that about 600 tons of masonry has fallen off the castle and they're believed to be er people trapped
Call Taker:	Ah bear with me a moment, erm
	(pause – on mute)
	sorry what's fallen and how much?
Police:	Er about 600 tons, of masonry
Call Taker:	600
	(pause – on mute)
	and it's Lewes castle you said?
Police:	Yeah
In background EOC Superviso	: r Do you have a postcode?
Call Taker:	Do you have a postcode at all?
Police:	Er Bravo, November 7
Call Taker:	Үер
Police:	1 Yankee, Juliet
Call Taker:	Bear with me
Police:	And that comes in as the Old Coach House which is, is basically part of the Castle
Call Taker:	Old Coach, Coach House?

In background: EOC Supervisor Is anyone injured?

Call Taker:	Is anyone, is anyone injured do you know?
Police:	Er, we don't know. Basically, Fire have told us that um they believe er possibly un, people are possibly under the masonry. unknown if they're dead or alive
In background EOC Superviso	: r Bear with me
Call Taker:	Hmm bear with me a moment
	(Long pause - on mute)
Call Taker:	Ok, just bear with me a moment
Police:	Thank you
	(pause)
Call Taker:	It's BN7 1
Police:	BN7 1 Yankee, Juliet yeah
Call Taker:	Brilliant ok
	(pause)
	Old coach, coach house is it Castle Ditch Lane do you know?
Police:	Er that's right yeah
Call Taker:	Yeah ok
In background EOC Superviso	r:-We're heading out to Lewes Castle
Call Taker:	But that's, that's were it is in Lewes Castle
Police:	Yeah
Call Taker:	Ok
In background EOC Superviso	r:-And do they have (inaudible)
Call Taker:	And how may tons? 600?
Police:	That's right yeah



## In background EOC Supervisor:-In terms of the wall, how many people do you think are?

Call Taker:	How many people do you think are in there?
Police:	Erm we, we don't know all we
Call Taker:	Unsure?
Police:	haven't got a clue
Call Taker:	So you got a call from Fire?
Police:	That's correct yeah
Call Taker:	Ok, unsure if people are dead or alive but you know that they're trapped?
Police:	Well that, this is the information they're giving to us
Call Taker:	Umm ok,
Police:	They, they just called up asking for search dogs which we are trying to provide
Call Taker:	Okerm
	(Pause)
In background: EOC Supervisor	How many Fire are attending?
Call Taker:	How many Fire are attending do you know?
Police:	Erm I, I don't know
Call Taker:	Ok
Police:	Ive got their reference should you need it
Call Taker:	Reference is?
Police:	Er 28412
Call Taker:	Brilliant
Police:	And ive got ours when you need that as well
Call Taker:	Yep, go ahead
Police:	Er 604
Call Taker:	Brilliant

In background. EOC Supervisor	: r Have we got a number for anyone on scene
Call Taker:	Do, do you have a number for anyone on scene at all?
Police:	Em I don't unfortunately, no it came straight to us from Ambulance erm sorry from Fire
Call Taker:	Erm ok just bear with me
	(Long pause - on mute)
	Do you know, do you mean mason, when you say masonry do you mean as in brick, concrete
Police:	Well they, well they, they described it as masonry so I'm assuming it's like bricks
Call Taker:	Bricks
Police:	and stones
Call Taker:	stones
Police:	Yeah like heavy wall
Call Taker	Is, is it a definite that there are people in there?
Police:	Er we, I I, I've literally I can only tell you what I've got I'm afraid
Call Taker	Ok
Police	And what they pass to us its just that its possible
	(pause)
	We are phoning them back trying to get more information
Call Taker:	Brilliant, ok bear with me
	(Long pause – on mute)
	Hello there
Police	Hi
Call Taker	If you get some new information could you give us a call back
Police:	Absolutely
Call Taker:	Erm the reference we're running on this is erm 2199 of today's date
Police:	Ok lovely,
